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### MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 03, SERIES OF 2012

***AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE CAMALIGAN RISK REDUCTION, EMERGENCY AND SAFETY MANAGEMENT OFFICE (CARRESMO), ADOPTING REPUBLIC ACT 10121 IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF CAMALIGAN, CAMARINES SUR.***

**SECTION 1. TITLE AND SCOPE** – This ordinance shall also be known as the “CARRESMO Ordinance” of the Municipality of Camaligan, Camarines Sur.

The rules provided in this ordinance shall govern the development of policies and plans and implementation of actions and measures pertaining to all aspect of disaster risk reduction and management, including good governance, risk assessment and early warning, knowledge building and awareness-raising, reducing underlying risk factors and preparedness for effective response and recovery.

**SECTION 2. LEGAL BASIS** – The implementation of this ordinance shall be governed by the following:

- (1.) The people’s constitutional right to life and property is a basic responsibility of the State.
- (2.) Section 12 of Republic Act No. 10121 also known as the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010 and Rule 6 of its Implementing Rules and Regulations mandates the creation of LDRRMO in every province, city or municipality under the office of the Governor, City or Municipal Mayor respectively.
- (3.) Section 443 of RA 7160 (c)(2) authorizes the Local Sanggunian to create other offices as necessary to carry out the purposes of the Municipal Government.
- (4.) Under the Implementing Rules and Regulations of RA 7160, specifically Article 119 thereof, the Sanggunian is authorized to create offices as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of the LGU or consolidate the functions of some offices with those of another in the interest of efficiency and economy. Likewise, the same rule authorizes it further to reorganize its present organizational structure or alter its present staffing pattern taking into consideration its priority needs, service requirements, and financial capabilities subject to the minimum standards and guidelines prescribed by the Civil Service Commission.

**SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS** – As used in this ordinance, the following words and phrases shall be construed as:

- (1.) RA 10121 is the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010 (DRRM Act) which transforms the Philippine's disaster management system from disaster relief and response towards disaster risk reduction (DRR). It was approved on May 27, 2010 and repealed PD 1566.
- (2.) LDRRMC or MDRRMC is a body composed of members coming from the different sectors and agencies in the community tasked to oversee the implementation of DRRM Plans formulated by the Local DRRM Office.
- (3.) LDRRM Office, also known as MDRRMO, is the generic name of the office tasked to set the direction, development, implementation and coordination of DRRM programs and activities within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Camaligan.
- (4.) Camaligan Risk Reduction, Emergency and Safety Management Office (CARRESMO) is the local counterpart of LDRRM Office.
- (5.) Risk Management is the systematic approach and practice of managing uncertainty to minimize potential harm and loss.
- (6.) Emergency Management is the organization and management of resources and responsibilities for addressing any unforeseen or sudden dangerous occurrence.
- (7.) Safety Management involves the assessment of hazardous environment, recommend safety practices and safeguard or prevent the entire community against unsafe acts.

**SECTION 4. ESTABLISHMENT OF AN OFFICE / COMPOSITION AND STRUCTURE** – There is hereby created the Camaligan Risk Reduction, Emergency and Safety Management Office, the local counterpart of the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (LDRRMO) in the municipality under the Office of the Municipal Mayor. It shall be composed of a Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Officer, designated by the Municipal Mayor, to be assisted initially by three (3) staff responsible for (1) Administration and Training (2) Research and Planning (3) Operations and Warning.

**SECTION 5. FUNCTIONS AND BUDGET OF THE OFFICE** – All activities related to Disaster Risk Reduction and Management, such as, but not limited to, pre-disaster preparedness programs including training, purchasing life-saving rescue equipment, supplies and medicines, for post-disaster activities, for payment of premiums on calamity insurances and construction of evacuation centers, shall be charged against the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund (LDRRMF), formerly the 5% Calamity Fund. The LDRRMC shall monitor and evaluate the use and disbursement of the LDRRMF based on the, Local Disaster Risk Reduction & Management Plan (LDRRMP) as incorporated in the local development plans and annual work and financial plans.

Of the amount appropriated for LDRRMF, thirty percent (30%) shall be allocated as Quick Response Fund (QRF) or stand-by fund for relief and recovery programs in order that situation and living condition of people in communities or areas stricken by disaster, calamities, epidemics, or complex emergency, may be normalized as quickly as possible.

Unexpended LDRRMF shall accrue to a special trust fund solely for the purpose of supporting disaster risk reduction and management activities of the LDRRMCs within the next five (5) years. Any such amount still not fully utilized after five (5) years shall revert back to the general fund and made available for other social services to be identified by the local Sanggunian.

**SECTION 6. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE** — Any provision or portion of this Ordinance found to be violative of the constitution or any other existing laws shall not impair the other provisions or parts thereof which shall continue to be in force and in effect.

**SECTION 7. REPEALING CLAUSE** — Local ordinances, rules and regulations or parts thereof, which are inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly.

**SECTION 8. EFFECTIVITY** — This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
